- 27-78= silver medals
- 78-155 = bronze medals

The IOI has come to an end and the contestants have received their medals. The closing ceremony took place yesterday afternoon at the Centro Congressi in Sirmione where the students were each called on stage to receive their hard earned prizes. Overall, 155 medals were handed out, 26 of which were gold, 51 silver and 77 bronze. The conference was opened with a general introduction by Matteo Campese and followed by a short speech by the Mayor of Sirmione, Alessandro Matinzoli. Other speakers were Mr Aristide Peli (Education Assessor of Brescia Province), Mr. Giulio Occhini (AICA director), Mr. Richard Forster (current IOI president), Mr. Giuseppe Colosio (Chair of IOI 2012) and Mr. Peter Taylor (future Chair of IOI 2013). Unfortunately, the opening and closing ceremonies were cursed with bad weather, but the days between showed the visitors and contestants the true wonders of Italy. All the representatives agreed on the success of the event in spite of the difficult weather. Hopefully, all those who participated will be able to take with them a suitcase of memories, new friendships and cultural richness. The ceremony terminated with a flag handover from Italy to Australia, a rite of passage from the end of IOI 2012 to the beginning of IOI 2013.

Behind the scenes at IOI2012 there is a very active organization.

It's difficult to summarize our week at the Garda Village. IOI is an intense experience in which every part of the adventure deserves to be mentioned. First of all, praise to our host the Garda Village, with its beautiful grounds, lakeside and varied restaurant. Although sometimes the power went off – like the competitors' drop in energy! – the Village offered a warm welcome and moments to relax.

The IOI 2012 competition was paperless. This idea with the decision not to print the newsletter saved the organization 50% on paper.

Social networks were a very useful way of keeping in touch during this IOI. Facebook, Twitter and Youtube IOI accounts were the best place for feedback by contestants and volunteers.

- IOI's Youtube channel reached 15.870 views, and our most watched video got 3001 visits.
- Our hashtag #IOI2012 appeared 509 times on Twitter!
- It's not easy to calculate how many people used our Facebook account to interact: data is updated every week and theoretically there are more than 50.000 contacts and our

audience – likers and likers' friends – reached 415.500 people.

- The official IOI website (www.ioi2012.org) during the competition days (Tuesday and Thursday) had almost 36.000 views with a total of 140.000 people for the whole week.
- Our Daily News was downloaded 4200 times, with a positive trend.

The bus
If Silvia arrives in the 5 minutes following the transit of a number 7 bus, she will catch n. 3; on the other hand if she arrives between the 5th and the 15th minute after the transit of a n. 7 bus she will catch the next n. 7.
Thus she catches the n. 7 bus with a frequency which is on average double that for the n. 3 bus.
